First of all our chief executive members will form the project team, in which the members of the organization, volunteers and other social workers who want to give their service, after forming the team, they will be sent for survey - in which areas there are needy people, in which areas How many packets are needed in this, so that the team does not have to wander for long about the food prepared, After this, kitchen setup will be set up with the help of workers, in which good and experienced cooks will be appointed as per the prescribed routine, which will be prepared according to the prescribed routine, which will be packed neatly and through small vehicles. The team of workers will be sent to the designated area.



About hunger in urban areas –

New Delhi: India has over 4 lakh beggars, with the highest 81,244 beggars in **West Bengal**, while Lakshadweep merely has two vagrants according to the 2011 census, Union Social Justice Minister Thawar Chand Gehlot informed the Rajya Sabha.

Associated with the problems of poverty and unemployment is the problem of beggary which is a social problem of great magnitude and grave concern in developing countries. Begging is a problem for society in as much as a large number of beggars means non utilization of available human resources and drag upon the existing resources of the society.

It is common to find beggars at rubbish dumb, road sides, and traffic lights and under flyovers. The frail, crippled and mentally ill share space with children, women and able bodied men. The line that separates beggars from the casual poor is getting slimmer in a country where one in every four goes to bed **hungry** every night and 78 million are homeless.

There are over 300,000 child beggars in India with a total population size of 1.2 billion, as the gap between rich and poor is wide, according to the Indian National Human Rights Commission. "These children find their way to the streets owing to diverse reasons, but mainly because of poverty and an unstable home.

Broadly beggars in India can be grouped into following eight categories:

- 1. Juvenile beggars
- 2. Physically and mentally handicapped;
- 3. Diseased; 4. Religious mendicants;
- 5. Able bodied;
- 6. Aged and infirm;

7. Casual beggars who resort to begging only as a stop gap arrangement till they are able to secure some casual employment or part time work again;

8. Professional/hereditary beggars: Certain communities consider begging as their profession and indulge in begging as a traditional or customary activity. This type of beggary is prevalent amongst the members of certain caste or tribal groups who lead a nomadic way of existence and earn their living by entertaining people through singing, dancing or performing acrobatic feats.



Targeted group of the Project proposal -

Although this awareness program will be for all needy and hungry people, but the major focus of the team is people living on footpaths, at railway stations, at bus stops, under flyovers and in slum areas of city, labourers who didn't get work on daily basis, rickshaw pullers who hardly get customers, and other people who is unable to earn for their food.



Geographical area of execution of project - The work area of the project will be the entire Howrah district especially in slum areas, road side, railway stations, bus stops and under flyovers where people are more needy, our project team will take survey of those places where will they get needy and hungry people then they will come with food according to need and will distribute peacefully every needy person.

Need of the project -

There is a dire need of this project, in the present time, after Covid pandemic the situation is more worst, many people who had a small source of income – they have lost their livelihood and struggling for basic needs, because they can't able to do enough savings for future.

In cities there are many people who came from other place for their livelihood, but due to lack of knowledge and support they lost everything sand mostly start begging, there are some beggars who has been ignored by their family in old age or in any serious disease, some are children beggars who are orphans and no one cares about them, so they have to beg in compulsion, some are differently abled people whose family leave them alone to wander here and there, they also select to beg for food, there are rickshaw pullers in cities who have to wait too long to get a passenger, because all have their own vehicles and mostly people use public transport, so their way of livelihood also dying and in lack of fund they can't able to start any other business, so they daily struggles for food – there are many people of these type in cities who need a support for food at least, because it's a major need for human body, So our organization proposing this CSR project to sponsoring agency, it will help to reduce hunger among needy and poor people.
